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

Medicine: 0.2% (12 hours) (Briggs et al 2015)






















Prioritising Pain Education

FOCUS ON 5 ISSUES: Integration, prevention, protection, participation and mobilisation



MOBILISATION



Enhance Pain assessment and care, education and training, for all involved healthcare professionals, especially in vulnerable populations, with a common core of knowledge
 Strengthen the role and functioning of care networks and pathways, interprofessional coordinations and coordination between hospital and ambulatory care
 Call for giving new momentum to an efficient policy in the fight against pain
 Recognize Pain as a crucial health issue, requiring a reinforced care pathway
 Recognize the Fight against pain as a priority of French Health Policy for the five-year term and beyond


